Special Educator (K-12)

Under the direction of the Head of School and the Director of Student Support Services, the K-12 Speech and Language Pathologist will identify the individual needs of each child in their caseload and create a healthy, inspiring, supportive and Godly learning environment. The K-12 Speech and Language Pathologist will be responsible for writing SGP (IEP) goals for students, meeting with parents, planning with K -12 grade level teachers, record-keeping, assessment, and advocating for each child in their caseload.

Duties and Responsibilities

- **Prevention** — SLPs are integrally involved in the efforts of schools to prevent academic failure in whatever form those initiatives may take; for example, in Response to Intervention (RTI). SLPs use evidence-based practice (EBP) in prevention approaches.
- **Assessment** — SLPs conduct assessments in collaboration with others that help to identify students with communication disorders as well as to inform instruction and intervention, consistent with EBP.
- **Intervention** — SLPs provide intervention that is appropriate to the age and learning needs of each individual student and is selected through an evidence-based decision-making process.
- **Program Design** — configure schoolwide programs that employ a continuum of service delivery models in the least restrictive environment for students with disabilities, and that they provide services to other students as appropriate.

Duties and Responsibilities (cont.)

- Data Collection and Analysis — accountable for student outcomes. Therefore, data-based decision making, including gathering and interpreting data with individual students, as well as overall program evaluation are essential responsibilities.
- Be well-organized and self-driven to create, assess and track the needs of students at varying levels in your classroom. (differentiated instruction)
- Build a Godly relationship with students, faculty and parents.
- Be compassionate, kind, and patient with students
- Strong written and verbal communication skills
